Notes on .eu Application Form (Sunrise 1)

Some or all of the registrant information may be made available on a public whois server, so individuals may wish to consider creating a unique email address for the purposes of registration.

Domain Name: May consist of 2-63 alphanumeric characters and hyphens.
Many two character domains are not allowed due to conflicts with ISO country codes.

Registrant Details: This must be the details of the actual registrant, not the agent. If the registrant is a natural person, leave the organization field blank.

The first line of the street address, the city/town, the postcode/county and the country are all mandatory, as is the phone number.

Email Address: It is vital that this email address be accurate and functional as this is the main way the registry will notify you about the progress of application, and where to send supporting documentation. ***If the application is being prepared by a patent attorney or other agent please be aware that they will need to access information sent to this address in order to submit supporting documents.***

Prior Right: Tick one right only per application. Trademark holders should specify the prior right name exactly the same as the trademark.

Public bodies should list the full name of the public body, and the territory governed by the body if relevant to the domain being registered. In general public bodies administering a territory should apply under "Public Body" – the Geographical Indication right is only for certain geographical indications rights protected by law.

Name Servers: If you know the name servers that you will use for the domain if your application is successful then enter them here, otherwise leave blank and we will supply name servers that may be used until you make other arrangements.

Application Fee: The application fee covers all processing costs and your first years domain registration fee if your application is successful. Successfully registered domains may be renewed on an annual basis for EUR29 + VAT or the rate prevailing at the time. The application fee is non-refundable, and does not guarantee registration of the domain as there may be other competing applications submitted.

Invoice: The registrant details supplied must relate solely to the registrant, and not to any agent handling the registration on their behalf. Unless arranged in advance, the application fee including VAT must accompany all applications, however a VAT invoice will be issued to either the registrant or the agent as required (send agent billing details separately if required).

Documentation: Supporting documentation is not required at the time of application but must be submitted within 40 days of EURid acknowledging the application. Documentation *should not* be sent to Irish Domains Ltd. A cover sheet for the documentation will be provided in the acknowledgement email from Eurid, this will contain the address to send it to. It is the sole responsibility of the registrant to ensure that the supporting documentation is correctly formatted, valid, and submitted on time.

Terms & conditions: The registration is subject to the .eu rules (including Sunrise rules and applicable dispute resolution procedures) as set by EURid. These may be viewed online at www.eurid.eu. The registration is also subject to Irish Domains standard terms and conditions as may be viewed online at www.irishdomains.com.

It is a condition of registration that the registrant (and agent) agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless Irish Domains Ltd and its servants or agents, against any loss, damage, liability, claim or expense resulting from a claim or claims asserted by a third party regarding ownership of or right to use the domain name in question. It is also a condition of registration that no liability shall attach to Irish Domains Limited or its servants or agents in respect of any loss or damage whatsoever suffered by the applicant or any third party arising from any action or neglect on the part of Irish Domains Limited or its servants or agents in the exercise of registering or maintaining domain names or in the provision of any other service.
